

**General Meeting of the  
Duval County Council of PTAs/PTSAs  
April 19, 2011**

**Call to Order**

The General Meeting was called to order at 10:02 am by the President, Melissa Kicklighter. The meeting was held at the Cline Auditorium of the Duval County School Board Building on Tuesday, April 19, 2011. The recording secretary recorded the minutes.

**President**

#### **Superintendent's Remarks**

She also shared that they are continuously working on balancing the budget. She added that despite what is going on with the budget, they are keeping the students excited until the last day of school through summer school. She reported that as part of the reading initiative, there is an extended reading time during summer for the students who are not proficient in reading and students who get 3 or lower score in FCAT.

She announced that graduation ceremonies begin May 25<sup>th</sup> until the last day of school.
